

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE Update 12

These pages summarise James's update in our 10:30 am service on 23 January when he explained where we are now with our Building for the Future project. If you prefer, you can watch the video here.

1. One project, three parts

Building for the Future (BFTF) is about equipping us to continue to play our part in building God's kingdom in Hurdsfield, Macclesfield and beyond. The project has three parts:

- Part 1: a new building
- Part 2: an improved site and welcome
- Part 3: more resource to help us grow our ministry.

2. Parts 2 and 3 complete or ongoing

Part 2 External and internal works complete

Hopefully you've seen and admired our smoothly tarmacked site; improved exterior lighting; and new footpath, bike racks and signage. And the redecorated church doors, lobby and lounge (currently serving as our church office).

Part 3 Jonny Frost is here

Jonny arrived as our curate in June and is making a huge difference to the ways we're able to develop our ministry amongst Hurdsfield people. He's already proposed a structure to the PCC to establish an ongoing programme that would continue long after he moves on in 2024.

Our BFTF project has enabled Jonny to join us, with Jenni, Layla and Lois, by funding their housing costs for the three years they're with us. The Church of England pays his stipend.

3. And at last, Part 1, a new building – we're almost there

We're excited that we've progressed discussions with a contractor to the point that we've agreed the design and contract arrangements to construct our new building.

Yesterday we visited the factory which will make our building. We're happy the construction quality is right for us, and will now proceed with signing the contract to build.

4. New building construction plan

Assuming we're able to sign a contract by the end of January, the proposed project plan would be:

March 2022 – construct foundations

April / May 2022 – construct building

June 2022 – fit out building

5. New building project budget

We told you in November that construction prices have risen significantly since we started this journey in January 2019, and that the money received and pledged would not be enough. We now have a firm budget for the building cost, so we know how much the whole project is costing.

6. How do we fund this increase in the budget?

Since January 2020, when we announced we needed to raise £383K, God has blessed us in an amazing way, including, recently, a very generous legacy from the estate of former HTH member Alan Potts, which the PCC believes is part of God's provision for this project.

We spent less money during two years of pandemic because we did less. You, however, did not falter and continued to give faithfully to our general expenses. This means we're able to add an additional £50K from PCC reserves to our BFTF project.

The PCC and I remain convinced that our BFTF vision is of God. The amazing way in which God is providing everything we need is testament to that.

As we look forward to watching our new building taking shape, we're able to look beyond BFTF and think about how we will use the foundation it gives us to grow our ministry.
